On the one hand – both big and small countries are dissatisfied;

On the other hand – to change them is

increasingly difficult.

THE REASON – TO A CONSIDERABLE EXTENT – STEMS FROM THE TIME AND SPACE FACTORS 2 10.07.14

APEC: TIME AND SPACE FACTORS Late 1980s- Mid 1990-s: time and space played FOR APEC

East Asian economic miracle;

*Track two process – Pacific Basin Economic Council and Pacific Cooperation Economic Council;

The advent of globalization.

APEC-2

Late 1990s – early 2012s – time and space played AGAINST APEC. Shift from globalization to regionalism

APEC – in crisis: *Crisis of goals and means; *Crisis of adaptability to new circumstances; *Crisis of identity.



Solution – two directions:

Free Trade Area of Asia-Pacific. Time and space play AGAINST APEC.
The discourse of connectivity. TIME AND SPACE PLAY FOR APEC.

TRANS-PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP Time and Space – play AGAINST TPP.

<u>Time</u>: no strong institutional and operational background.

<u>Space</u>: no preconditions for further expansion.





Time and Space – play AGAINST RCEP.
Time: the deadline is 2015.
Space – too diverse to unify terms of cooperation.

SECURITY CHALLENGES

The South China Sea issue;

The North Korean nuclear and missile developments;

*Non-traditional security challenges (piracy and maritime robbery).

The SOUTH CHINA SEA ISSUE

Space and time – play for the CONSERVATION of contradictions.

Space:

The Unites States factor - a SHIFT of contradictions;

Pan-regional multilateral platforms – no progress;

[◆]Moving from DOC to COC – in a stalemate;

THE SCS ISSUE - 2

The space factor (cont). The issue – 3 levels:

1.Sovereignty – 6 participants;

2.Sino-ASEAN level – negotiations about COC;

3.Sino-American level – First and Second island

chains vs Air-Sea Battle.

THE SCS ISSUE - 3The space factor (cont)

At present: an internal imbalance

Contradictions – have shifted to the Sino-American level; While

Negotiations – are conducted between China and ASEAN.

THE SCS ISSUE - 4

The time factor: No one is interested in moving from DOC to COC.

*The US – doesn't want to cross the "red line" in relations with China;

China – doesn't want to lose advantages outlined in DOC;

*ASEAN – doesn't want to demonstrate its internal contradictions.

THE NK NUCLEAR ISSUE

Time and space – play for the CONSERVATION of the issue. The time factor (institutional dimension):

SPT – were unable to prevent NK from developing its nuclear weapons;

UN Sanctions – didn't influence on NK leadership;

International Atomic Energy Agency (as well as KEDO) – a failure.

THE NK NUCLEAR ISSUE - 2 The space factor: *SPT and ARF – lack of coordination of efforts;

***US-SK pressure on NK** – complicated rather than lessened the contradictions.

The NK – US talks – no results;

Russia – NK bilateral relations – a possible solution?

Piracy and Maritime Robbery: the Malacca Straits as a Case Point Space – plays AGAINST the resolution. *Within ARF – impossible. The SCS precedent. *Within EAS or ADMM Plus – hardly possible. The factor of Internal Imbalance; *Within ReCAAP – only information sharing.

Piracy and Maritime Robbery: The Malacca Straits as a Case Point - 2 The Malacca Straits: Four-Party Patrolling



Piracy and Maritime Robbery: The Malacca Straits as a Case Point-3 Time – suggests a very limited progress. *This problem is long-lasting; *The internal priorities factor; *The foreign assistance factor;

CONCLUSION Another paradox:

On the one hand – Asia-Pacific is rapidly globalizing. Issues and processes – not only regional, but also GLOBAL dimension.

On the other hand – solutions are shifting to NARROW rather than REGION-WIDE scale.

Institutions – LIMITED effectiveness
