

PRESENTATION OF THE PROGRAM

The MENASA program – Middle East, North of Africa and Sahel Studies of the College of Social Sciences at the International University of Rabat (UIR) offers a rigorous, interdisciplinary curriculum designed to develop students' understanding of the sociopolitical, geopolitics, security and cultural richness of three regions.

MENASA is a great opportunity given the prominence that Africa as a continent has gained in recent years and the vision of Africa Rising, a continent with many employment and investment opportunities. The focus on the Sahel is therefore fundamental in terms of security, encompassing all security 'regimes'; peacekeeping operations, social security, economic, environmental and military security.

Whilst strongly rooted in its locality and mission, the International University of Rabat is international in outlook, vision and character and in the reach and impact of its academic education, professional training and innovative research programs. UIR is the ideal environment for international students searching for an immediate, experience-based overseas pedagogical program for either a semester or a full academic year.




The MENASA Summer School proposes a specialized course on the Sahel in order understand the dynamics of political violence, the rise of armed organizations of different ideologies, the rivalries of international and regional actors that are making the Sahel a region of securitisation and finally, to increase the understanding of a Sahero-Sahelian space that is facing new realities such as Climate Change and the consequences they are having on a space dedicated to livestock farming, pastoralism and agriculture.


The course distinguishes between three Sahel(s): the Geographic Sahel, the Institutional or Political Sahel and the Security Sahel. All three are fundamental to study at a time of exponential rise in violence and the trans nationalization of violence on the borders of Liptako Gourma (Central Sahel).

The aim of this course is also to rethink security and through the different security regimes which is, today, a hot topic especially after the impact of the French military intervention at 2013. The Sahel lies at a security crossroads threatened by polyhedral actors who move between organized crime and the struggle for ethno-territorial control.


O2. LOCATION



She is coordinator of Sahel Research at the MENASA Program at College of Socials Sciences (UIR). As member of the research team at the Laboratoire d'analyse des sociétés et des pouvoirs - Afrique / Diasporas (LASPAD) of Gaston Berger University (UGB), she is participating in a project of surveys of security perception in Sahel (Mali, Níger and Burkina Fasso). Her current areas of interest and work focus on security, migration, identities, political Islam, conflicts, armed groups and the criminal economy in the Maghreb and Sahel region. She also has over 15 years' professional experience as an international analyst for the communications media.

Mesa is a member of various scientific associations and is the author of several articles, including, but not limited to: La falsa yihad: el negocio del narcotráfico en el Sahel (Dalya, 2013) and Les groupes armés du Sahel. Conflict and the Criminal Economy in Northern Mali (Halfa, 2021).

His current research focuses on the impact of climate change in the highly vulnerable countries of the region. Villalón holds a Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin, and degrees from the Institut d'Etudes Politiques in Paris, the School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) of the Johns Hopkins University, and Louisiana State University.

Nizar Messari, currently an Associate Professor at Al Akhawayn University in Morocco, has held various leadership roles within the institution, including Dean of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences and Vice President for Academic Affairs.
